

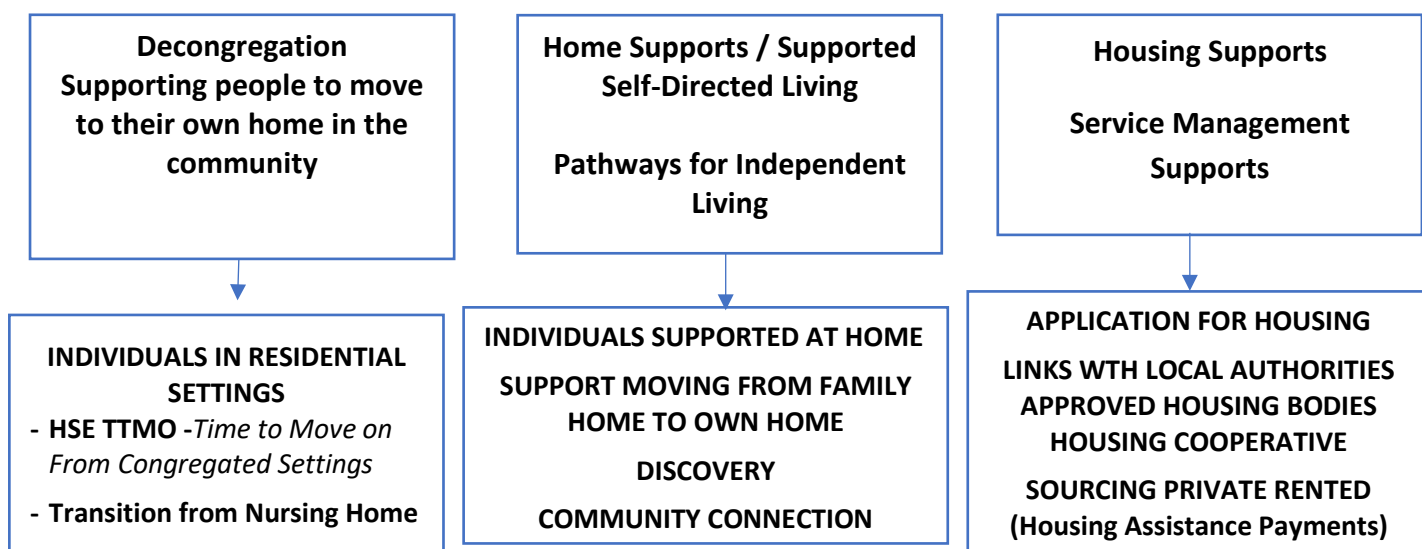
**SERVICE PROFILE & REFERRAL PATHWAY**

**SERVICE REFERRAL CRITERIA**

**CLIENT GROUPS WITHIN THE SCOPE OF ST. MARGARET'S SERVICES**

<p><b>1. Adults with Intellectual Disability</b> Where cognitive impairment falls below normal levels Borderline - Mild Intellectual Disability – not in HSE service criteria Moderate – within the HSE scope of service criteria <b>Within the scope of St. Margaret's Service Framework</b></p>
<p><b>2. Acquired Brain Injury</b> Where all rehabilitation pathways are completed. Mild to moderate Cognitive impairment <b>Review on a case-by-case basis</b></p>
<p><b>3. Adaptive Impairment-</b> Neurodiversity (ADD/ ADHD/ SPD/ ASD/ DCD) Individual whose adaptive functioning is mild to moderate <b>Review on a case-by-case basis</b></p>
<p><b>4. Neuro-Degenerative Disorders</b> Primary diagnosis of intellectual disability with neuro-degenerative disorders as a secondary diagnosis including Parkinson's-Motor Neuron Disease- Multiple Sclerosis and not requiring highly specialised nursing and medical intervention in their care plan. <b>Review on a case-by-case basis</b></p>



## CLIENT GROUPS NOT WITHIN THE SCOPE OF ST. MARGARET'S SERVICES

<p><b>1. Neuro-Degenerative Disorders</b>                  As a primary diagnosis - including Parkinson's-Motor Neuron Disease- Multiple Sclerosis                  Highly medical needing nursing &amp; MDT input                  No long-term stability in support needs - degenerative outcomes requiring regular nursing care.                  Skill-mix cannot support increasing medicalised care pathway  <b>Not within our Scope of Service</b></p>	
<p><b>2. Mental Health including BPD</b>                  Therapeutic and medical intervention &amp; pathway  <b>Skill-mix cannot provide quality service outcomes for the individual</b></p>	

## ST. MARGARET'S SERVICE OFFERING - SUPPORTED SELF-DIRECTED LIVING

<p><b>Individualised Bespoke Supports</b> - Working with the individual through our Framework of Supported Self-Directed Living, supporting a person move to/in their own home, supporting them to exercise their rights as citizens and have the services &amp; supports they need in their life; flexibly responding to their changing choice and need throughout their life.</p>
<p><b>Discovery Programme</b> – Working on a one-to-one basis with individuals, to create opportunities for them to participate in and with their local community, in ways that will support them build their capacity and confidence to actively engage locally, building natural supports and achieving “the universal good life”.</p>
<p><b>Employment Supports</b> –Individually working with each person, we support them to gain the experience and skills to create opportunities for them to enter the workforce.</p>
<p><b>Community Connection</b> - Working on a one-to-one basis with individuals, to create opportunities for them at home and in their wider community.</p>
<p><b>Decongregation</b> –Supporting people to move from living in residential congregated settings, service owned housing, family home, other living arrangements to their own home and to exercise their will, preference and choice in their journey and throughout their life as we continue to support them through our Framework of Supported Self-Directed Living.</p>

## REFERRAL & ADMISSION PATHWAY

<b>1. Admissions Policy</b>
<b>2. Referral Application completed from Referral Agency</b>
<p><b>3. Documentation to be included with application form:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• DSAMT from a referral agency</li> <li>• Medical and Multi-Disciplinary Clinical reports</li> <li>• Previous provider – social report / day service reports, etc</li> </ul>
<p><b>4. Initial review by Admissions Committee:</b>                  Within/Not Within Service Scope <u>or</u>                  Under Review – refer to the Support Intervention Advisory Group (Clinical Externs)</p>
<b>5. Within the Service Scope / Within the Service Scope with complexity / Not within the Service Scope – advise referring agency</b>
<b>6. Advise Referring Agency</b>
<b>7. Accepted Referral: undertake assessment with individual and, where appropriate, significant people in their life.</b>
<b>8. Complete Service Costing - submit to referral agency</b>
<b>9. Funding Approval – recruit team / source housing for agreed service package.</b>
